But what families don't often realise is that many of the best 'gifts' are not found on any retail shop shelf - and they aren't the most expensive ones either. Have you considered some of these ideas for gift giving:

Handmade scrapbooks: A scrapbook filled with photos, notes and keepsakes from the past is a beautiful way to bring your family's history to life. You can curate themed pages adorned with photos, ticket stubs or mementos to reflect special memories – think family holidays, childhood memories or important milestones. Alternatively, consider a picture frame to display a collection of items that together tell a story. Vintage photographs, concert tickets or handwritten letters are all good starting points.

Storyworth: This website allows users to answer questions about their past, including questions that can be submitted by friends and family members. At the end of the year, the answers are compiled into a book. These stories offer insight into family traditions, adventures and life lessons. A great gift for the older generations to give to the family's younger generations.

Digital frames: A modern twist on a classic present, a digital frame shares hundreds of photos in a rotating display. Certain frames allow you to preload a selection of family snapshots, while others can be added to remotely (via cloud technology or even email) for a display that constantly changes as your family does. Furniture with meaning: Passing down a cherished piece at this time of the year can have great significance. Hers is a life well crafted

On full display around her cosy, colourful suite at Palm Lake Care Bethania, Helena Jutte's incredible artistic creations tell the equally as colourful story of her life.

Helena has always navigated the world creatively. Though her life story spans decades and continents, craft has been a constant companion. Though Helena was born in Holland, home in her early years was the Caribbean Dutch colony Curaçao. Helena's family moved there when she was just two years old, so that her father could find work as a builder. She credits her worldview to those formative years in Curaçao, where she was one of only a few white children in her class.

"I grew up surrounded by Curacaoans. I could speak the language and everything," Helena smiles.

These early years also fostered Helena's love for learning and curiosity. Though her teens saw her family move back to Holland, she still felt the pull of far-off places.

"Holland never felt like my country," she says.

Chasing adventure, Helena eventually moved to Africa – specifically, Tanzania and South Africa. Encountering firsthand the complexities of apartheid, she noticed the stark contrast to the harmony she had known in Curaçao.

"It was so different," she reflects. "Even the beaches were segregated."

Eventually, Helena made her way back to Holland – where a whole new kind of adventure awaited her. Though she and her husband, Wilhelm (Wil), had met when they were teenagers, their romance didn't spark until Helena returned in her mid-20s. "I was in girl guides with his sister, but I didn't like him at first," Helena admits with a chuckle. "I went out with other people, you know? But I will always remember my mother saying to me, 'Marry well.' So I did. Wil and I got married when I was 26."

Sixty-three years of happy marriage later, Helena is glad she took her mother's advice on board. The pair have always complemented each other's interests. He was 'the brainy one', an engineer, while Helena preferred to work with her hands. Together, they raised three children while moving across the globe – Holland, then Africa, and finally Australia in 1980. Leaving behind political instability in South Africa, Australia offered new opportunities and a sense of permanence. And through it all, Helena's love for creating has never wavered. Her self-taught skills range from knitting and crochet to carpentry and painting.

"If I see something, I can make it," she says. "I like to look at things and say, 'How can I use it? What can I use it for?"

Helena's art incorporates objects found around our Palm Lake Care Bethania community – medicine cups, CDs, cotton wool balls, twigs from the outdoor gardens. From vibrant emus to intricate Christmas crafts, Helena's work does more than just brighten up her room; she loves loaning out her creations to decorate the walls and communal spaces of Palm Lake Care Bethania. This 83-year-old certainly shows no signs of stopping.

"I'm busy every day," she says, proudly.

With so many of her life's stories to weave into her work – the wildlife of Australia and Africa, the tulips of Holland, the beaches of Curaçao – Helena will no sooner run out of memories to capture than she will materials to capture them with.
